Speakers

Dr. Kelly Ballantyne is a resident of the American College of Veterinary Behaviorists under the mentorship of Dr. John Ciribassi. She consults on behavior problems in dogs and cats through Chicagoland Veterinary Behavior Consultants and the Chicago Center for Veterinary Medicine. Additionally, Dr. Ballantyne teaches companion animal behavior at the University of Illinois College of Veterinary Medicine. Dr. Ballantyne received her DVM with honors from the University of Illinois College of Veterinary Medicine in 2005 and a B.S. in Biology from the University of Illinois in 2001. Prior to her behavior residency, she practiced primary care veterinary medicine at a private hospital in Oak Park, IL. She lives in Chicago with her husband Rob, dogs Bludger and Tonks, and cat Aengus.

Dr. Ken Lambrecht has been the medical director of a preventive oriented veterinary practice since 1996. He is the previous owner/director of 4 Paws Swim & Fitness, a fitness center and rehab facility. He is the current chair of Pet Nutrition Alliance (PNA) Tools Committee and owner and medical director of West Towne Veterinary Center, Madison, WI. Preventive practice interests are in dentistry, nutrition, feline specific and infectious disease.

Dr. Ilona Rodan is the medical director and owner of the Cat Care Clinic in Madison, WI, with special emphasis in feline behavior. She lectures internationally and consults to help get cats back into practices, teach handling techniques, and how to make the practice environment "feline-friendly". Dr. Rodan is a past-president of the American Association of Feline Practitioners, and has co-chaired a number of guidelines developed by the American Association of Feline Practitioners (AAFP) and joint AAFP and AAHA guidelines, including Behavior, Pain Management Guidelines, Feline Handling, and Environmental Needs Guidelines. In 2005, she was awarded the AVMA Animal Welfare Award for her leadership and contributions to advancing feline welfare.

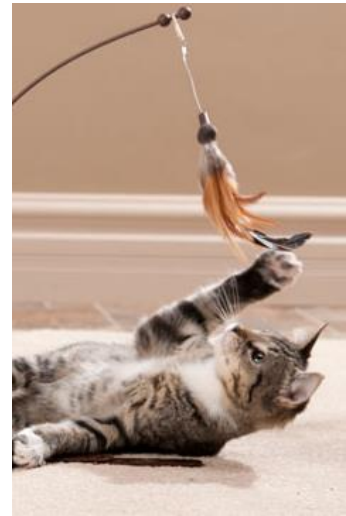
